About Diagnostic Assessment

What is Diagnostic Assessment?

In simple terms, diagnostic assessment means to diagnose or discover the students' difficulties while learning and assess the problem accurately.

When to conduct Diagnostic Assessment?

About two weeks at the beginning of the year (in the month of May), schools need to conduct some form of diagnostic assessment to clearly understand the current levels of students in terms of FL and previous grade-level competencies.

What to assess?

- Foundational goals/competencies as specified in NIPUN Bharat.
- A few competencies based on the Los of previous 2 grades.

How to assess?

• Both oral and written.
